The purpose of research is to solve problems. Scientists and scholars study our environment in the hopes of improving and enriching our lives. Knowledge is produced by government, academic, and commercial sources and is packaged into information that is distributed in different formats.

Libraries collect, organize, and provide access to information and librarians can assist you with your information needs.

Your information need will often dictate the type of sources you consult. For most research:

- If you don't know much about your topic, consult a general or subject encyclopedia to find an overview and some basic information to get started.
- When you have narrowed your topic and are ready to explore a subject in depth, it's time to find books on your subject.
- The next step is to find journal articles about

Remember that:

- Journals, because of their scholarly nature are more useful than magazines for academic research papers. However, they are useful, current information for some topics.
- A lot of information is also available on the Internet. Information sources on the Web should be scrutinized and carefully evaluated for accuracy, completeness, authority and purpose.
